Per the new supervisor: to report any issues on the trails (like downed trees, overgrown, or washouts) please call the headquarters 508-476-7872 (land line) or directly to his state cell phone at 857-408-0348 (Joseph Taylor). Feel free to pass along this information to anyone using the forest.





Length: 5 miles +/- , repeat for 10 miles +/- NEHT affiliated.

Location: Baker Road, Thompson CT. From route 193S (coming from Massachusetts), take the sharp, hairpin left downhill onto East Thompson road, heading toward the Speedway.

After about 1/2 mile, take the first paved right onto Alm Road. If you pass the Speedway, you've gone too far. Follow Alm Road to the end. Take a left onto Baker Road. There will be a BSTRA sign to direct you to the left turn into the field. For GPS use: 165 Baker Road Thompson, CT. That will get you close. Watch for signs!

If you're coming from the Douglas end of East Thompson Road, please swing wide when you are taking that left onto Alm Road so you don't have any issues with your trailer.



Imagine my surprise when the dentist came out to do everyone's teeth and it was Jack's turn. Dave flipped up Jack's upper lip and there on his gum was this red irritated area. Detective time, what the heck was causing that? Culprits - the hay bags and Port a Grazer. With no teeth to "grab" the hay out of the hay bags, the gums (mostly the upper gum) comes into contact with the webbing and reaching for hay through one of the holes in the Port a Grazer he may be hitting his gum as he bites down, no teeth to



run interference anymore. Pulled out the hay bags and Port a Grazer and he healed right up.

This is something that none of the vets involved in extracting his teeth ever mentioned. So, sharing what we learned! BK




