DCR's Wompatuck State Park Circulation Master Plan Project

I attended this public meeting on June 26th as a follow up from the first public meeting that they held regarding Wompatuck.

The slide below shows the proposed curated bridle paths. That means those trails will specifically be built/maintained to specifications required for horseback riders.



They stated that the three loops are about 2 to 4 miles each and that is not an optimal distance for horseback riders.

These loops were designed with trailer parking in mind and access to water. The picture above shows the Orchard Picnic Area where there parking for truck/trailer where the cursor arrow is. They planned a little paddock area where you can put your horse and then sit at the picnic tables to have lunch or just visit a bit.

My questions at the end of the presentation were as follows:

- 1) Comparing the current bridle trails to the proposed, is there a net loss or gain? DCR: The proposed overlaps with some of the current bridle trails but much more extensive, so there is an increase.
- 2) Can we connect all the loops? Mentioned during the presentation there was the possibility to connect the upper left to the bottom loop through the campground road. Can we make this definite connection? DCR: would like to work with eques-

trian users to work out some of these details.

3) Can we use some of the other proposed curated trails? Mentioned was the Naval History trail that I would love to check out on horseback. DCR: worried about trail user conflicts, but something that we can look into. If you can currently use the trails now, then they should be open.

4) Clarified the presumption that they had to provided water for horseback riders. I let them know that everyone carries water with them to make sure we do have water. So this is not something that they need to worry about.







From Mass Parks For All

On Monday, July 29, Gov. Maura Healey and Lt. Gov. Kim Driscoll signed a \$57.8 billion FY2025 budget into law, which contains a reasonable increase for the Department of Conservation and Recreation (DCR). The budget is retroactive to July 1, when the new fiscal year began.

The document contains an \$8.4 million increase for DCR's day-to-day operating expenses. The Parks and Recreation Operations account (2810-0100), which funds general operating expenses, jumped from \$105.6 million to \$110.0 million, a 4.2 percent increase. The Seasonal Employees account (2800-0501) received a \$4.0 million bump to \$28.5 million, a 15.7 percent increase. DCR uses these funds to staff campgrounds, beaches, pools, and other facilities that see peak summertime use.

The Administration has approved DCR to spend \$152 million on capital projects for FY2025, a \$5.0 million increase over FY2024.
