Fort Hill Farms Ride sponsored by Hope Botanicals & Crothers Tire Co.

Spring has indeed sprung, and it sure has been a wet spring so far. April 19th even gave us a touch of summer with humidity and temperatures above 80.

The trails were not too bad when they were marked on Friday, but by Saturday the 50% humidity and the winds/low pressure system worked



against us to pull the water UP out of the ground, making the fields muddy.

Despite the mushy footing, there were areas to move out, but a slower pace allowed the 55 riders to enjoy Fort Hill Farms' spectacular views and explore the interesting features of the farm.

The white VOR (Very High Frequency Omni-Directional Range) that overlooks the field where we parked, is used by aircraft to help determine their direction and compass heading. Nearly all flights to our region pass over or at least "ping" this tower.

The Red barn with the cows is a robotic milking parlor. The farm oversees 200 milking cows. The Parlor is automated, and cows can select when they wish to be fed and milked. Robots clean the facility 24 hours a day and ensure they are in optimal health.

Our route passed by the farm's biodigester. Manure from the cows, and restaurant food waste (from as far away as Newport and Cape Cod), is processed in the pits to extract the methane, which is converted to electricity to fuel the farm. Excess electricity is supplied to the electric grid.

Our generous hosts - the Orr-LaVack family - were so gracious to allow our club to use their farm and their corn maze area to host this trail ride. We were fortunate to ride on their 1200 plus acre property. This is only the second time in fifteen years that horses have traversed these trails at an event like ours

Four generations of the Fort Hill Farms family joined us at lunchtime - from great-grandmother, Norma, two of her daughters, Kathy and Kristen, granddaughter, Kies, to two-year-old great granddaughter, Adelaide.

The menu included a great pasta salad donated by Karen Parlin and followed by delicious desserts donated by many BSTRA members. Additional desserts included were Echo Farm puddings in maple and vanilla flavors, donated by Kies Orr-LaVack. Fort Hill Farms sells these puddings and other locally produced items in their store, The Farmer's Porch, located on O'Leary Road.

Stop by for gifts, treats, honey and dairy products - this is a self-serve stand operating on the honor system, open 24 hours a day.

Park Serve Day Upton State Forest

Well, April 27 for Upton turned out better than the 26th for Douglas which had to be cancelled. (We will work on rescheduling that!)

We had a total of 15 volunteers and 3 DCR staff members for a total of 42 hours of service work.

The trail crew consisted of Anna-Maria Paul, Becky Kalagher, Sheila Shafer and Sylvia Stewart. Our goal was to tackle the Old Hopkinton Spring Trail.

Where the trail heads in from Southboro Road, it's pretty much straight up the hill





and we know that is not a good layout for a trail. With a meeting before the trail work day with DCR Upton supervisor Ray Longvall, we discovered someone beat us to the punch with laying out a more friendly track going up the hill which incorporated switchbacks. With Ray's approval, we were good to clear that up some.

Not only did we get that cleared up, we also cleared and cut back Old Hopkinton Spring Trail down to where it turns left up the hill. All totaled we improved .48 of a mile for our total of 14 hours.

The rest of the volunteers worked at the headquarters building raking, picking up tons of branches and spreading

mulch. Those hard workers were Charlotte Canning, Cameron Ostiguy, Suzanne Nicholas, Ellen Arnold, Angie Knott, Bill Taylor, Deb Deschenes, Brian Gallagher and the Perry Family. Park staff working with us and the Friends of Upton State Forest were Ray Longvall, Amber Drummond, Chris Hollenbeck. The volunteers put in 28 hours of service.

BSTRA Board meetings are usually on the first Thursday of the month. If you wish to attend one of our meetings, drop us an email and we will send you the meeting link.






