

BSTRA's 2025 Year in Review: Stewardship, Service & Strengthening Our Trails

As we look back on 2025, one thing is clear: even in a year of transition, BSTRA's commitment to trail stewardship never wavered. Our members showed up, boots on the ground, hands in the dirt, voices at the table, to ensure that equestrian access and sustainable trails remain protected across Massachusetts, Connecticut, and Rhode Island.

Thanks to your dedication, generosity, and volunteer spirit, BSTRA continued to make a meaningful impact on the landscapes we love.

Fundraising & Events: Powering Trail Improvements. Through the combined efforts of our members, supporters, and event participants, BSTRA raised \$15,430.86 specifically for trail projects in 2025. Our events remained a cornerstone of community engagement, with volunteers contributing 689.54 hours to planning, hosting, and supporting rides and activities. Fundraising efforts added another 150.42 hours, ensuring that every dollar raised was backed by countless hours of behind-the-scenes work. We hosted 15 rides with 472 riders, including 166 non-members and 35 juniors, helping introduce new faces to our mission. We also enjoyed two campouts and gathered 34 attendees for our annual Volunteer Appreciation Luncheon.



Meetings, Advocacy & Representation

BSTRA members continued to serve as strong advocates for equestrian access and responsible land management. In 2025, volunteers dedicated 75.63 hours to meetings, site visits, and public engagement, including:

- Touring Wyndham Land Trust properties
- Participating in the Thompson, Groton, and Douglas Trails Committees
- Representing BSTRA at the RI Federation of Riding Clubs
- Meeting with the North Brookfield Sportsmen's Club to secure a new ride venue
- Attending DCR public hearings for four State Forest Trail Master Plans
- Engaging in educational webinars
- Meeting with Douglas and Upton State Forest Supervisors
- Learning about the Environmental Bond Bill and its implications for trail funding
- Participating in Friends of Upton State Forest meetings

This work ensures that equestrian voices remain part of statewide trail planning and conservation conversations.

Trail Projects: Planning, Partnerships & Progress

Behind every mile of trail is a story of collaboration. In 2025, BSTRA volunteers invested 24.40 hours in project development, scouting, and coordination, including:

- Partnering with Camp Marshall and Spencer Snowbirds on bridge repairs
- Assessing Franklin State Forest trails
- Exploring a potential Mid-State Trail relocation in Douglas State Forest
- Reviewing Wyndham Land Trust's new parcel for future connections
- Evaluating the Pump House Trail in Oxford
- Assisting Upton State Forest with relocating the Middle Trail Bridge and reviewing a reroute on Old Hopkinton Spring Trail
- Receiving Certificates of Compliance for BSTRA property and the Red Pine Trail project in Douglas State Forest
- Touring BSTRA property with Metacomet Land Trust
- Donating geotextile material to Gloucester Land Trust for a horse-safe bridge

These efforts lay the groundwork for future improvements and long-term trail sustainability.

Trail Work: Hands-On Stewardship Across Three States

Our volunteers put in 159.63 hours of physical trail work-valued at \$6,704.46-with \$124.73 spent on lunches to keep everyone fueled. Work included:

Douglas, MA – Town Property & School Trails

- 8 work days, 28 hours. Cleared 1.4 miles of trails

Thompson, CT

- 5 work days, 41 hours

Oxford, MA – Hodges Village Dam

- 1 work day, 12 hours. Cleared 0.86 miles

Upton State Forest

- 1 work day, 42 hours. Cleared 0.48 miles

Douglas State Forest

- 2 work days, 3.5 hours

BSTRA Property

- 1 work day, 1.17 hours

Groton, MA

- 1 work day, 6 hours



Exeter, RI

- 2 work days, 20.5 hours

Every hour represents sweat, teamwork, and a shared belief that trails matter.

Writing, Communications & Outreach

Behind the scenes, BSTRA's communications efforts continued strong. A total of 171.6 hours went into:

- Website updates
- Facebook posts
- Bugle articles
- Legislative support letters
- Event paperwork
- Fundraising materials
- Surveys and reports



Clear, consistent communication keeps our members informed and our mission visible.

Giving Back: Donations That Strengthen Our Trail Community

BSTRA also supported partner organizations whose work aligns with our mission:

- Wyndham Land Trust – \$500 to preserve land open to horseback riding
- Mass Parks for All – \$500 to advocate for accessible, well-maintained public lands
- Friends of Upton State Forest – \$201.23 for future trail improvements
- LeGrand Reynolds Horsemen's Camp (Exeter, RI) \$250 for new campsite numbering posts
- Gloucester Land Trust – Donated geotextile material for a horse-safe bridge

These contributions help ensure that equestrians remain valued partners in conservation.

Pet Estate Planning Webinar

BSTRA hosted a Pet Estate Planning Webinar on Saturday, January 10th. Estate planning is often associated with designating how our property and assets are distributed to spouses, children, friends, or relatives after we pass away. However, it is also important to consider the future of our horses and other pets in these plans.




Key Topics Discussed

- Including pets such as horses in your estate planning.
- Deciding who you want to care for your pets if you are no longer able to do so.
- Allocating money specifically for the care of your pets.
- Outlining care instructions in the event you become incapacitated.
- Specifying your wishes regarding your pets' end-of-life, including whether you want them cremated or buried in a special place.

Allison T. Piorier, a partner at KKC Law in Vernon, CT, guided attendees through the available options for including pets in their estate plans. She addressed important questions to ensure the well-being of pets, such as who will care for them, how to provide financially for their needs, and what to do if the owner becomes unable to make decisions.



2026 BSTRA Top Trail Horse Challenge

The 2026 Top Trail Horse BSTRA Challenge is now open. To participate you must be a BSTRA member in good standing and a Top Trail Horse member.

Top Trail membership is \$35 per year, providing access to their website and GPS app for tracking. Miles can be uploaded with tracks from any app that allows exporting standard GPS formats such as .gpx. The Top Trail app logs directly to the website, but I have found it to be buggy at times as it is relatively new. When I use it, I still track on my usual app just in case. The Top Trail app does have a feature to edit a track if you forget to turn it off.

Existing challenge riders are automatically rolled into the 2026 challenge. New participants can join the challenge by going to the website (<https://toptrailhorse.com>). Select my groups in the menu under your username and click the **Join Group** button at the bottom of the page.

Top Trail offers their own challenges. See <https://toptrailhorse.com/news/12220> for more information.

This past year questions about “Qualified Rides” versus “Disqualified” and “All” came up. The Top Trail site automatically looks for GPS anomalies or rides upload past ten days and disqualifies those tracks from their challenges, but they do count disqualified tracks in lifetime miles. You can use the filter to see them.

The BSTRA challenge uses **all** miles filtered by ride type, **trail**. However, it is good practice to upload tracks quickly so that the leaderboard is updated. One trick when viewing the leaderboard is to set the filters to all miles and ride type trails as some members, including me, do track arena miles.

Logging miles challenges me to get out and ride more! And then there is the friendly competition..... Hope to see on and the trails and the leaderboard in 2026!

*NEHT Affiliated Rides

1. Unless otherwise, noted all rides start at 10:00 am and trail workdays at 9:00 am.
2. Most rides require advance registration and payment to receive lunch.
3. Riders 17 and under, accompanied by a guardian, ride **free** (lunch included if pre-registered). (There may be exceptions on some rides)
4. Alcohol is prohibited on State property. No smoking allowed while riding. A current Coggins within a year of the ride date is required.
5. Please leave the trail & parking areas better than you found them and be considerate of others! Clean up your hay & manure at all rides.
6. Year end awards require a member in good standing to have a minimum of 4 hours of volunteer time completed.


